National Public Lands Day is the nation's largest hands-on volunteer effort to improve and enhance public lands. The BLM Little Snake Field Office will be celebrating NPLD on Saturday, September 29 at the Sand Wash Basin Herd Management Area. Sand Wash Basin is located approximately 45 miles from the city of Craig off of Colorado Highway 318 on County Road 67. Sand Wash Basin has some of the most colorful wild horses in Colorado and is a popular OHV riding area. Volunteers donate 4 hours of their time and will help in removal of wire and trash from the HMA. Because of the distance, the event will be an overnight camping trip with a weenie and marshmallow roast on Friday. Camping will be approximately 1.5 miles past the Sand Wash Basin entrance (CR 67) on BLM Road 2067A2; just look for the NPLD Camping sign. Volunteers should meet at the Sand Wash Basin corrals on CR 67 at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday.

All volunteer are treated to a free BBQ, t-shirt, free fee-free day pass to a participating public land (i.e., National Park, Forest Service, etc.), goody bag, and a free raffle for a chance to win one of two mountain bikes and other prizes.
