The Bureau of Land Management, Little Snake Field Office will be hosting a Cache In Trash Out Event as part of the 15th Annual National Public Lands Day on September 27, 2008. Volunteers should meet at the Little Snake Field Office at 8:00 a.m. sharp.

A Cache In Trash Out Event is an activity intimately tied to geocaching. Volunteers will be given GPS coordinates to specific work sites. Each group will have to use the coordinates to locate their work site and then perform specified tasks. After the work is completed, another set of coordinates will be given out to a location for a new geocaching box.

The event will start off with a brief introduction to map reading, operation of GPS units, and what Geocaching is all about. After the work day, volunteers will be given a tour of the proposed Interpretive Drive on Duffy Mountain. The tour will end with a complimentary visit to the Juniper Hot Springs, so bring your bathing suits! Juniper Hot Springs is only one of three known springs to contain more than six minerals (Juniper contains 24). The other two are located in Europe. You will also receive:
