PROGRAMMATIC AGREEMENT

AMONG THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT,

THE COLORADO STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICER,

THE ADVISORY COUNCIL ON HISTORIC PRESERVATION AND

THE OVER THE RIVER CORPORATION

REGARDING THE OVER THE RIVER ART DISPLAY

WHEREAS the Bureau Of Land Management, Royal Gorge Field Office (“BLM”) plans to make a decision on a land use permit sought for the Over The River Art Display pursuant to Section 302 of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976 (P.L. 94-579; 90 Stat. 2743; 43 U.S.C. 1732), under 43 CFR 2920 regulations; and

WHEREAS the undertaking consists of construction, display, and removal of a temporary art exhibit along the Arkansas River in Colorado; and

WHEREAS, BLM has defined the undertaking's area of potential effect (APE) as a series of non-contiguous parcels encompassing 573 acres, of which 480 acres are BLM-administered land, and the rest are a mix of state and private land (Attachment 1); and

WHEREAS, BLM is authorized to conduct consultation regarding the effects of its undertakings on historic properties by the National Historic Preservation Act, implementing regulations in 36 CFR 800, the National Programmatic Agreement (“NPA”), and BLM’s State Protocol Agreement (“Protocol”) with the Colorado State Historic Preservation Officer (“SHPO”); and

WHEREAS, BLM has determined that the undertaking may have indirect and/or cumulative adverse effects on the historic properties in the APE, which are eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places (“NRHP”), and has consulted with the SHPO pursuant to the Protocol; and

WHEREAS, 117 sites and isolated finds are present in the APE, and 73 of the sites are either individually eligible for the NRHP, or support the eligibility of a linear site, and three of the sites are classified as “needs data”, and are therefore treated as if they have been determined eligible for the NRHP (Attachment 2), and the 76 NRHP-eligible or needs data sites are hereafter identified in this Programmatic Agreement (“PA”) as “historic properties”, pursuant to 36 CFR 800.16; and

WHEREAS, although all historic properties in the APE are subject to possible indirect adverse effects (such as trampling, vandalism and looting), seventeen historic properties (Attachment 3) are of particular concern because of their sensitivity and proximity to activity areas within the APE; and

WHEREAS, The Over The River Corporation (“OTR”) has re-engineered portions of the proposed display, moved vehicle access roads and altered planned construction methods in order to eliminate direct effects on all historic properties, in keeping with BLM’s goal of avoiding historic properties whenever possible; and

WHEREAS, BLM has consulted with the Apache Tribe of Oklahoma, Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes of Oklahoma, Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe, Comanche Tribe of Oklahoma, Crow Creek Lakota Tribe, Jicarilla Apache Nation, Kiowa Tribe of Oklahoma, Northern Arapaho Tribe, Northern Cheyenne Tribe, Ute Tribe, Oglala Lakota Tribe, Rosebud Sioux Tribe, Shoshone Tribe, Southern Ute Indian Tribe, Standing Rock Sioux Tribe and the Ute Mountain Ute Tribe, and none of them identified historic properties with religious and cultural significance, and the Tribes were invited to consult further and BLM received no responses; and

WHEREAS, BLM has identified and contacted potential consulting parties (OTR, Colorado Preservation Inc., the National Trust for Historic Preservation, the Chaffee County Heritage Area Advisory Board, the Fremont County Heritage Commission and the Fremont Custer Historical Society), and only OTR has asked for and received consulting party status; and

WHEREAS, BLM has consulted with OTR regarding the effects of the undertaking on historic properties and has invited it to sign this PA as an invited signatory; and

WHEREAS, BLM will perform environmental analyses under the National Environmental Policy Act for mitigation for non-cultural resources prescribed by the Over The River Environmental Impact Statement, and will ensure that Section 106 compliance is completed prior to any mitigation for non-cultural resources activities in order to prevent possible adverse effects to historic properties; and

WHEREAS, BLM notified the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (“ACHP”) of the adverse effect finding, pursuant to the NPA, and the ACHP agreed to participate in the consultation;

NOW, THEREFORE, the BLM, the SHPO, the ACHP, and OTR (“signatories”) enter into this PA, and agree that the undertaking shall be implemented in accordance with the following stipulations in order to take into account the effect of the undertaking on historic properties.

STIPULATIONS

BLM shall ensure that the following measures are carried out:

I. MEASURES TO AVOID, MINIMIZE OR MITIGATE ADVERSE EFFECTS ON HISTORIC PROPERTIES

A. Pre-Construction Period

1. Fencing

a. In order to preclude possible indirect adverse effects to Site 5FN2536, (***), OTR will place a temporary fence around Features 1, 2, 3, 4, and 11, and will place a temporary fence along the eastern edge of the dirt road on the northwestern side of the *** (Attachment 4). This temporary fence will terminate on the north side of the *** and will run for at least 200 meters (656 feet) to the northwestern boundary of the site or until the fence line reaches a topographic feature with which tie-in of the fence would be logical and practical. The fences will comprise BLM-approved temporary fencing to prevent pedestrian or vehicular access. OTR will ensure that the fences remain in good condition through pre-construction, construction, display and removal periods.

b. OTR will fence the ponds on Site 5FN2522 using temporary fencing materials, and will ensure that no personnel will enter the fenced portion of the historic property at any time. OTR will ensure that the fences remain in good condition through the pre-construction, construction, display and removal periods.

2. Mitigation for Non-cultural Resources Within the APE

a. If mitigation for non-cultural resources prescribed by the Over The River Environmental Impact Statement will occur inside the APE, BLM will analyze the specific location of the proposed mitigation to determine whether the activities may affect a historic property within 10 working days of receiving a formal request for cultural resources review.

b. If the proposed mitigation will not affect historic properties, within 10 working days of completing Stipulation I (A)(2)(a), BLM will prepare a map illustrating the location of the proposed mitigation within the context of the APE, and will submit it, along with a letter of explanation, to SHPO and OTR.

c. If the proposed mitigation will affect a historic property, BLM will seek to reposition the mitigation to avoid the historic property.

d. If the proposed mitigation cannot be repositioned, BLM will follow procedures

detailed below in Stipulation I (A) (3)(b–f).

3. Mitigation for Non-cultural Resources Outside of the APE

a. If mitigation for non-cultural resources prescribed by the Over The River Environmental Impact Statement will occur outside of the APE, BLM will conduct a literature review of the specific location of the proposed mitigation to determine whether the activities will occur in an area that has already undergone cultural resources inventory and whether the activities may affect a known historic property within 10 working days of receiving a formal request for cultural resources review.

b. If the mitigation for non-cultural resources is planned for an area that has been inventoried and no historic properties were identified, BLM will notify OTR and SHPO that the mitigation will have no effect on historic properties within 10 days of completing Stipulation I (A)(3)(a), pursuant to Section VIII (C)(1) of the Protocol.

c. If the mitigation for non-cultural resources is planned for an area that has been inventoried and historic properties were identified or if the area has not been inventoried, OTR will hire or will cause to be hired a contractor with a BLM Cultural Resource Use Permit in good standing (“CRUP”) to conduct a cultural resources inventory of uninventoried acreage and/or reevaluate known historic properties, complete documentation of the findings, and make recommendations regarding eligibility, effect and treatment of historic properties (“treatment”).

d. BLM will follow evaluation and consultation procedures detailed in Sections VII and VIII of the Protocol, and will include OTR in all consultation.

e. If historic properties are identified and an adverse effect is unavoidable, OTR will hire or will cause to be hired a contractor with a CRUP to produce a treatment plan. The treatment plan must meet the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Archeological Documentation (“Secretary’s Standards”).

f. Once it receives an acceptable treatment plan, BLM will submit a copy of it to the SHPO and seek the SHPO’s concurrence with the proposed treatment.

g. Within 10 working days of receiving a treatment plan that meets the Secretary’s Standards, BLM will submit a copy of it to the SHPO and seek the SHPO’s concurrence with the proposed treatment. Within 10 working days of receiving the treatment plan from the BLM, SHPO will review it and notify the BLM of its concurrence or non-concurrence with the proposed treatment. If the BLM and SHPO do not agree on the proposed treatment, BLM, SHPO and OTR will consult until agreement is reached.

h. When the contractor has completed the fieldwork, it will submit a preliminary report to the BLM pursuant to Special Condition 8 of the BLM Colorado State Office CRUP. If the preliminary report contains enough information for BLM to determine that the treatment has been completed satisfactorily, it may issue a Notice to Proceed.

i. When BLM receives a final treatment report that meets the Secretary's Standards, it will submit the final report and site forms to the SHPO within ten working days.

4. Prior to the commencement of construction activities, BLM and OTR will together conduct site condition assessments of the historic properties listed in Attachment 3, which are historic properties that are particularly vulnerable to indirect adverse effects. Current conditions will be documented with photographs and geospatial data, as necessary, and will be summarized in the first pre-construction monitoring report.

5. OTR will ensure that all work crews receive training about cultural resources, relevant ethical issues and the Archaeological Resources Protection Act ("ARPA") before they begin work.

B. Construction Period

1. Monitoring

a. OTR will furnish a monitor with a CRUP during the installation phase of construction near Sites 5CF927, 5CF2690/5FN2509, 5FN2511, 5FN2513 and 5FN2516. Monitoring will be necessary at all times when ground-disturbing activities (such as anchor installments) occur, and when work within 100 feet of the historic property boundary will involve extensive use of the access routes.

b. If the monitor observes that any historic properties are being impacted, the monitor will have the authority to halt the work in the work within a minimum of 100 feet of the discovery and will immediately notify the BLM. Within 48 hours, BLM will consult with the SHPO and OTR to determine the next course of action. Within 10 working days, BLM will issue a notice to proceed if, in consultation with SHPO, it determines that the impact to historic properties is not adverse and that no additional impact to historic properties will occur. However, if BLM, SHPO and OTR determine that planned construction activities cannot avoid adverse effects to historic properties, BLM will not issue a notice to proceed until the BLM, SHPO and OTR have consulted and agreed upon a course of action that will cause no adverse effects to historic properties.

c. OTR will provide a monitor with a CRUP that will visit the APE and the

historic properties listed in Attachment 3, as well as any other historic property, at the discretion of the monitor, on a monthly basis to determine whether the historic properties have been impacted (by construction, vandalism, pothunting, trampling, or other activities). The monitor will document the results of the construction period monitoring visits in a monthly single-page report to the BLM, due within five working days of the monitoring visit. The report may be delivered to the BLM electronically, in PDF format.

d. BLM will also conduct monitoring of the APE at its discretion. The results of the BLM's monitoring visits will be documented.

e. If a monitor, whether a contractor or BLM employee, observes that any historic properties listed in Attachment 2 are being impacted, the monitor will have the authority to halt the work a minimum of 100 feet of the historic property, and will immediately notify the BLM. BLM, SHPO, and OTR will follow the procedures detailed in I(B)(1)(b) of this PA.

f. If any archaeological monitor observes that the stipulations in this PA are being violated, the monitor will immediately report the violation to the BLM. BLM, SHPO and OTR will together determine the next course of action, following procedures detailed in I(B)(1)(b) of this PA.

2. Discoveries

a. In the event that potentially eligible cultural resources are discovered during any phase of the undertaking, work in the immediate vicinity of the discovery will cease. OTR will immediately notify the BLM of the discovery.

b. BLM and OTR will ensure that the cultural resources are protected from further disturbance using physical protection measures and/or monitoring, as appropriate, until decisions about treatment are made and any necessary treatment is completed.

c. Within 10 working days of the discovery, OTR will hire or will cause to be hired a contractor with a CRUP to evaluate the discovery, complete documentation of the findings, and make recommendations regarding eligibility and effect, and, if necessary, treatment of historic properties.

d. BLM will follow evaluation and consultation procedures detailed in Sections VII and VIII of the Protocol, and will include OTR in all consultation.

e. If the BLM determines that the impact to historic properties is not adverse and that no additional impact to historic properties will occur, it will issue a notice to proceed within 10 working days of receiving SHPO's concurrence with its

findings.

f. In the event that historic properties are identified and an adverse effect is unavoidable, OTR will hire or will cause to be hired a contractor with a CRUP to produce a treatment plan that meets the Secretary's Standards.

g. Within 10 working days of receiving a treatment plan that meets the Secretary's Standards, BLM will submit a copy of it to the SHPO and seek the SHPO's concurrence with the proposed treatment. Within 10 working days of receiving the treatment plan from the BLM, SHPO will review it and notify the BLM of its concurrence or non-concurrence with the proposed treatment. If the BLM and SHPO do not agree on the proposed treatment, BLM, SHPO and OTR will consult until agreement is reached.

h. When BLM and SHPO reach agreement on the proposed treatment, OTR will hire or will cause to be hired a contractor with a CRUP to perform and document the treatment.

i. When the contractor has completed the fieldwork, it will submit a preliminary report to the BLM pursuant to Special Condition 8 of the BLM Colorado State Office CRUP. If the preliminary report contains enough information for BLM to determine that the treatment has been completed satisfactorily, it will issue a notice to proceed.

j. When BLM receives a final treatment report that meets the Secretary's Standards, it will submit the final report and site forms to the SHPO within ten working days.

k. In the event that the discovery includes possible human remains, BLM will notify the coroner of the county in which the discovery is located, and will begin the NAGPRA consultation process if the coroner concludes that the human remains are Native American in origin. If the NAGPRA consultation process is necessary, work at the discovery location may not begin again until BLM and the consulting tribes agree that the work will not desecrate the burial site, and until BLM has issued a Notice to Proceed.

C. Display Period

1. OTR will provide monitors that hold a CRUP to work with BLM's law enforcement staff during the display period. The monitors will develop a program for monitoring the historic properties listed in Attachment 3, and will submit a report detailing the monitoring plan to BLM for approval no later than 60 working days before the display opens. BLM will submit the approved display monitoring plan to the SHPO within 10 working days of receiving it from OTR,

and the SHPO will review the plan within 10 days of receiving it from the BLM. If the SHPO disagrees with the BLM's recommendations for monitoring during the display period, BLM, SHPO and OTR will consult until agreement is reached regarding display monitoring.

2. BLM staff may elect to be onsite to monitor during the display period, and will coordinate with BLM's law enforcement staff.

3. If a violation of ARPA is observed by a monitor during the display, the monitor will notify BLM law enforcement personnel. BLM law enforcement staff, in conjunction with BLM ARPA-trained archaeological staff, will perform any necessary investigation.

D. Removal Period

1. OTR will provide a monitor that holds a CRUP to monitor Sites 5CF927, 5CF2690/5FN2509, 5FN2511, 5FN2513 and 5FN2516 during removal of the art display. The monitor will remain at each site until all work in the within a minimum of 100 feet has ceased.

2. If the monitor observes that any historic properties are being impacted, the monitor will have the authority to halt the work in the immediate vicinity, and will immediately notify the BLM. Within 48 hours, BLM will consult with the SHPO and OTR to determine the next course of action. Within 10 working days, BLM will issue a notice to proceed if, in consultation with SHPO, it determines that the impact to historic properties is not adverse and that no additional impact to historic properties will occur. However, if BLM and SHPO determine that planned construction activities cannot avoid adverse effects to historic properties, BLM will not issue a notice to proceed until BLM and SHPO have consulted and agreed upon a course of action that will cause no adverse effects to historic properties.

2. Temporary fencing at Sites 5FN2522 and 5FN2536 will not be dismantled until the art display has been completely removed and until all work within a minimum of 100 feet of the site has ceased.

3. Monitoring of historic properties with the possibility of indirect adverse effects will continue until the art display is completely removed and all workers have left the APE.

4. After the art display has been completely removed, BLM and OTR will together conduct site condition assessments of the historic properties listed in Attachment 3. Conditions will be compared with documentation in the first pre-construction monitoring report, and a final monitoring report containing a synopsis of monitoring activities, along with a review of any site re-evaluations, will be submitted to the BLM and SHPO within 10 working days of the final site visit.

E. Surety Bonding

OTR will post a surety bond sufficient to cover the costs of all aspects of cultural resources work. The surety bond, or the balance thereof, will be returned to OTR after removal of the art display and after all cultural resources work, including monitoring, has ceased.

F. Changes to the APE

1. In the event that changes to the APE are necessary, OTR will immediately notify BLM, and will include maps and a shapefile in NAD 83 that illustrate the proposed changes.

2. If any signatories to this PA perceive a need to make a change to the APE, they will notify the BLM.

3. Upon receipt of the change notice, BLM will notify all signatories to this PA that a change to the APE is proposed, and all signatories will consult on proposed changes and make a decision within 10 days.

4. If the parties find that a change to the APE is necessary, procedures detailed in Stipulation I (A)(3)(a-i) above will be followed.

II. DURATION

This PA will expire if its terms are not carried out within five (5) years from its effective date following execution. Prior to such time, BLM may consult with the other signatories to reconsider the terms of the PA and amend it in accordance with Stipulation VIII below.

III. MONITORING AND REPORTING

No later than January 31 of each year following the execution of this PA until it expires or is terminated, BLM shall provide all parties to this PA a summary report detailing work undertaken pursuant to its terms. Such report shall include any scheduling changes proposed, any problems encountered, and any disputes and objections received in BLM's efforts to carry out the terms of this PA.

IV. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Should any signatory to this PA object at any time to any actions proposed or the manner in which the terms of this PA are implemented, BLM shall consult with such party to resolve the objection. If BLM determines that such objection cannot be resolved, BLM will:

A. Forward all documentation relevant to the dispute, including the BLM's proposed resolution, to the ACHP. The ACHP shall provide BLM with its advice on the resolution of the objection within thirty (30) days of receiving adequate documentation. Prior to

reaching a final decision on the dispute, BLM shall prepare a written response that takes into account any timely advice or comments regarding the dispute from the ACHP, signatories and concurring parties, and provide them with a copy of this written response. BLM will then proceed according to its final decision.

B. If the ACHP does not provide its advice regarding the dispute within the thirty (30) day time period, BLM may make a final decision on the dispute and proceed accordingly. Prior to reaching such a final decision, BLM shall prepare a written response that takes into account any timely comments regarding the dispute from the signatories and concurring parties to the PA, and provide them and the ACHP with a copy of such written response.

C. Carry out all other actions subject to the terms of this PA that are not the subject of the dispute and that remain unchanged.

V. AMENDMENTS

This PA may be amended when such an amendment is agreed to in writing by all signatories. The amendment will be effective on the date a copy signed by all of the signatories is filed with the ACHP.

VI. TERMINATION

If any signatory to this PA determines that its terms will not or cannot be carried out, that party shall immediately consult with the other parties to attempt to develop an amendment per Stipulation V, above. If within thirty (30) days (or another time period agreed to by all signatories) an amendment cannot be reached, any signatory may terminate the PA upon written notification to the other signatories.

Once the PA is terminated, and prior to work continuing on the undertaking, BLM must either (a) execute an MOA or PA pursuant to 36 CFR 800.14(b)(3) or (b) request, take into account, and respond to the comments of the ACHP under 36 CFR 800.7. BLM shall notify the signatories as to the course of action it will pursue.

Execution of this PA by the BLM and SHPO and implementation of its terms evidence that BLM has taken into account the effects of this undertaking on historic properties and afforded the ACHP an opportunity to comment.






ATTACHMENT 1: APE MAPS



— Arkansas River



OTR APE: Project Overview










OTR APE: Tunnel Panel Area




OTR APE: Vallie Bridge Panel Area and Vallie Bridge Limited Rest Stop




OTR APE: Turnaround Section






OTR APE: Texas Creek Panel Area, Staging Area, and Limited Rest Stop






OTR APE: Maytag Panel Area




OTR APE: Three Rocks Panel Area




OTR APE: Spikebuck Panel Area




OTR APE: Parkdale Panel Area




OTR APE: Fremont Road Visitor Information Center
