

Sub-Regions (Travel Management Areas) and the Desired Future Outcomes

- **Sub-region A** – Protect and improve the area for wildlife, Threatened & Endangered/BLM sensitive species, and preserve riparian habitat while maintaining adequate access for public and/or administrative use as appropriate.
- **Sub-region B** – Maintain Camelback Wilderness Study Area values and qualities
- **Sub-region C** – Protect and improve the area's range and wildlife habitat while allowing suitable recreational opportunities/experiences and maintaining adequate access for public and/or administrative use as appropriate.
- **Sub-region D** – Provide a wide range of quality recreational opportunities/experiences for all users, balanced with resource protection, while maintaining adequate access for public and/or administrative use as appropriate.
- **Sub-region E** – Protect sensitive plant communities and associated wildlife while providing a range of quality and suitable recreational opportunities/experiences and maintaining adequate access for public and/or administrative use as appropriate.
- **Sub-region F** – Sustain multiple uses through traditional means of travel, while providing quality and suitable recreational opportunities/experiences and adequate access for public and/or administrative use as appropriate, without compromising resources.
 - *Traditional means of travel include hiking, horseback riding, mountain bike riding, motorcycle riding, ATV riding, and 4-wheel driving*
- **Sub-region G** – Preserve the area's natural character and scenic qualities while providing quality and suitable recreational opportunities/experiences and adequate access for public and/or administrative use as appropriate.
