
## Deferred Maintenance Projects

### Need

In Colorado, deferred maintenance projects will address safety concerns at BLM administrative facilities as well as public recreation sites. These projects will resolve issues including, but not limited to: accessibility at recreation sites; communication systems; energy conservation; removal of unsafe, aging facilities; and protection and restoration of natural lands.

### Recovery Act Funding

BLM Colorado received \$3.8 million in ARRA funding for 17 projects in Alamosa, Chaffee, Delta, Garfield, Grand, Gunnison, Hindsdale, Huerfano, Mesa, Moffat, Montezuma, Montrose, Rio Blanco and Routt counties.



### Benefits

These projects will improve BLM Colorado's recreation sites while protecting natural resources. In addition, the repairs will improve the safety at BLM administrative facilities.



### More Information

#### Mud Springs Campground Reconstruction Project

The Mud Springs Campground Reconstruction Project received ARRA funding to replace unstable and inaccessible picnic tables and replace a dilapidated perimeter fence. The campground is located in Mesa County and is a popular area that provides numerous recreational activities on surrounding public lands. The old timber, worm fence that encircles the campground protects the public from vehicular traffic on an adjacent county road and protects the wildlife and flora from the public. The fence was replaced to provide a safe campground for public users.
