CASTLE ROCK, COLORADO:

GENERAL INFORMATION

Castle Rock, Colorado (Mountain Standard Time) is one of the fastest growing towns in the country. It is located in very close proximity to Sedalia, Colorado, where we will access the Rampart Range Motorized Recreation Area, in the Pike National Forest. Rampart Range is a nationally know area with many miles of trails available for OHV recreation.

Elevation: 6202 feet

Average annual precipitation: 16.6 inches per year

Terrain: Plains leading to Mountains

Average January temperature: 30 degrees. Average July temperature: 73 degrees

Average Humidity: 40%

Average Days of Sunshine per year: 255

Highway Access: Interstate Highway, I-25, runs North - South through Castle Rock and links the community with the major East – West Route of I-70 which runs through Denver to the North.

Air Services: **Denver International Airport**, Located 47 Miles to the Northeast of Castle Rock. **Colorado Springs Municipal Airport**: Located 45 miles south of Castle Rock.

RAMPART RANGE MOTORIZED RECREATION AREA, PIKE NATIONAL FOREST:

GENERAL INFORMATION

Home to over 100 miles of OHV designated trails, the Rampart Range Motorized Recreation Area is located approximately 35 miles southwest of Denver, CO. Average Elevation: 7300 feet

Colorado residents are required to have an OHV registration or license plate on their Motorcycle or ATV. You must have a license plate to ride on the roads.

Trails range in difficulty from Beginner to Expert and will take from 2-3 days to ride every trail. There are several developed campgrounds throughout the area. Maps are available at local businesses and area motorcycle dealers.
