
**APPLICANT: New Cingular Wireless/AT&T Wireless**

**DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED ACTION: New Cingular Wireless/AT&T Wireless (AT&T) has applied for a communication site on Mt. Bross to operate a wireless mobile system. AT&T would co-locate with Verizon Wireless who was issued a communication use lease on Mt. Bross on February 19, 2004. AT&T proposes to place two equipment cabinets on a temporary steel platform at the base of the monopole. The cabinets would measure approximately 3' x 3'. Power and telephone connections would be obtained from the local utility companies servicing the site. Six new 8' antennas would be mounted on the existing 80 foot tower at a height of 55 feet. It is anticipated that some minimal grading (5-10 cubic yards) would be necessary to create flat space for the proposed new equipment. The access to the site comes off of County Road 20. There are five other AT&T sites being constructed within Grand County. These new sites would add another option for a wireless mobile system to the public.**



**DECISION**

It is my decision to implement the Proposed Action, as mitigated in DOI-BLM-LLCON02000-2013-0005-CX, authorizing the co-location of AT&T and Verizon Wireless at the Mt. Bross communication site. AT&T will add six 8' antennas to Verizon's tower and two equipment cabinets at the base of the tower.

**COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS & CONFORMANCE WITH THE LAND USE PLAN**

This decision is in compliance with the Federal Land Management and Policy Act, the Endangered Species Act, and the National Historic Preservation Act. It is also in conformance with the December 19, 1984; Updated February 1999 Kremmling Resource Management Plan (RMP).

**PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT** : Verizon Wireless was contacted and confirmed in writing acceptance of the co-location. Grand County had AT&T on their agenda in November for a Special Use Permit. The EA will be available for a formal 30-day public comment period when posted on the Kremmling Field Office's internet website.

**RATIONALE**

The Proposed Action is categorically excluded from further documentation under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) in accordance with 516 DM 11.9, E(12). This categorical exclusion is appropriate in this situation because there are no extraordinary circumstances potentially having effects that may significantly affect the environment. The Proposed Action has been reviewed, and none of the extraordinary circumstances described in 43 CFR 46.215 apply.

**ADMINISTRATIVE REMEDIES**

Administrative remedies may be available to those who believe they will be adversely affected by this decision. Appeals may be made to the Office of Hearings and Appeals, Office of the Secretary, U.S. Department of Interior, Board of Land Appeals (Board) in strict compliance with

the regulations in 43 CFR Part 4. Notices of appeal must be filed in this office within 30 days after publication of this decision. If a notice of appeal does not include a statement of reasons, such statement must be filed with this office and the Board within 30 days after the notice of appeal is filed. The notice of appeal and any statement of reasons, written arguments, or briefs must also be served upon the Regional Solicitor, Rocky Mountain Region, U.S. Department of Interior, 755 Parfet Street, Suite 151, Lakewood, CO 80215.

The effective date of this decision (and the date initiating the appeal period) will be the date this notice of decision is posted on BLM's Kremmling Field Office internet website.
