

Dear Interested Party:

The Bureau of Land Management's Uncompahgre Field Office is seeking public comments on the preliminary Norwood-Burn Canyon Comprehensive Travel Management Plan Environmental Assessment (EA). The Norwood-Burn Canyon Travel Management Planning Area is approximately 9,852 public land acres located about two to three miles west of Norwood. A 30-day public comment period is intended to allow the public to review the proposed action and make additional comments.

The Uncompahgre Field Office initiated the travel planning process in August of 2012. Since that time, BLM staff has been working on an EA that analyzes 4 alternatives for an inter-connecting trail system on public lands managed by the BLM. BLM is seeking additional public comment on the 4 alternatives through May 6, 2014.
