DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED ACTION:

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


Figure 1. The figure above illustrates the geographic location of the proposed segment of existing road (symbolized as a red line) where the dust suppressant will be applied.

The applicant proposes to apply two dust suppressant products on County Road (CR) 76 in June 2012 (see Figure 1). The two products include Champion Charter Plus and Champion Charter Booster. These products are typically used as a soil binder and as a dust suppressant. The Champion Charter Plus as well as the Champion Charter Booster contains no petroleum products or by products, nor do they contain any chemicals deemed hazardous (see Attachments 1 and 2). Therefore both products will not harm fish, wildlife, or plant matter. The applicant is unaware of any other similar applications or dust suppressant projects in the project area. The applicant will treat approximately 1.5 miles of CR 76 with approximately 90 gallons of dust suppressant. The dust suppressant will be applied using a spray bar that is attached to a vehicle. The dust suppressant would be applied once, and monitoring would begin within 24 hours of the application of the test dust suppressant. Monitoring will include visual inspection of both the type and volume of traffic using the test segment. In addition, the efficacy of each dust suppressant will be assessed visually based on the amount of dust that is generated by vehicle traffic throughout the test period, which will be approximately two to three weeks.

Design Features: The applicant will notify the BLM project leader within 24 hours of project implementation and within 24 hours of completing the project. The BLM project leader for this project is Brett Smithers (Phone: 970-878-3818).

**REMARKS:**

*Cultural Resources:* The route along Rio Blanco County 76 has been covered by all or portions of a least four, or more, inventories at the Class III (100 Percent) pedestrian level (c f. Gruebel et al 2008 compliance dated 5/4/2009, Hauck 2001 compliance dated 6/11/2001) with cultural resources identified along the route or within 330 feet (100 meters) of the road. The proposal does not involve any new ground disturbance activity along the county road. If there is no ground disturbance there is limited potential to disturb any potential cultural remains with construction activity. No impacts to known cultural resources are anticipated from the dust suppression proposal.

*Native American Religious Concerns:* No Native American Religious Concerns are known in the area, and none have been noted by Northern Ute Tribal authorities. Should recommended inventories or future consultations with Tribal authorities reveal the existence of such sensitive properties, appropriate mitigation and/or protection measures may be undertaken.

*Special Status Wildlife Species:* There are no listed or proposed animals that are known to inhabit or derive important benefit from the project area. A small remnant population of greater sage-grouse, candidates for Endangered Species Act (ESA) listing and a BLM-sensitive species, are associated with the Magnolia area, but over the past 20 or more years have been confined to sagebrush dominated habitats east and north of the RBC 76 and 3 intersection. Although vegetation treatments designed to improve the suitability of habitat for the birds has been applied to areas adjacent to Proposed Action, there has been no known grouse dispersal to or use of these potential habitats. Dust suppressants as a general group are not known to pose health risks to

these birds (unlikely avenues for intake) or adversely influence offsite vegetation as cover or forage.

*Special Status Plant Species:* The project area occurs within the vicinity of habitat associated with the federally threatened species *Physaria congesta* and *Physaria obovata*. A portion of the Proposed Action intersects potential habitat for these species and a survey for these areas was completed by Hayden-Wing Associates in June 2010. There was no highly suitable or occupied habitat found as a result of this survey. The Proposed Action will have no conceivable effect on special status plant species. If future plant surveys in the area find occupied habitat of special status species in close proximity to the proposed dust control road segment, and if additional applications of the proposed dust suppressant, in addition to the one application that was analyzed in this document, is required, a more detailed analysis may be required to ensure there are no negative impacts to these species.

**DECISION**

It is my decision to implement the Proposed Action, as described in DOI-BLM-CO-2012-0030-CX, authorizing the application of the Champion Charter Plus and Champion Charter Booster dust suppressant products.

**Mitigation Measures:** None.

**COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS & CONFORMANCE WITH THE LAND USE PLAN**

This decision is in compliance with the Endangered Species Act and the National Historic Preservation Act. It is also in conformance with the 1997 White River Record of Decision/Approved Resource Management Plan.

**PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT**

Internal scoping was initiated when the project was presented to the White River Field Office (WRFO) interdisciplinary team on 4/3/2012. External scoping was conducted by posting this project on the WRFO's on-line National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) register on 3/30/2012. As of 5/22/2012, BLM received no comments or inquires related to the Proposed Action.

**RATIONALE**

If implemented, it is reasonable to assume the Proposed Action would reduce the amount of fugitive dust entering the atmosphere as result of vehicle traffic traveling on the test road segment. Moreover, the reduction in the volume of fugitive dust entering the atmosphere would most likely result in decreased impacts to air quality.

**ADMINISTRATIVE REMEDIES**

**State Director Review**

Under regulations addressed in 43 CFR 3165.3(b), any adversely affected party that contests a decision of the Authorized Officer may request an administrative review, before the State Director, either with or without oral presentation. Such request, including all supporting documentation, shall be filed in writing with the BLM Colorado State Office at 2850 Youngfield Street, Lakewood, Colorado 80215 within 20 business days of the date such decision was received or considered to have been received. Upon request and showing of good cause, an

extension may be granted by the State Director. Such review shall include all factors or circumstances relevant to the particular case.

Any party who is adversely affected by the decision of the State Director after State Director review, under 43 CFR 3165.3(b), of a decision may appeal that decision to the Interior Board of Land Appeals pursuant to the regulations set out in 43 CRF Part 4.
