

Idaho Fire Restriction Zones/Areas

Area 1

Starting at Weiser, Idaho follow the Idaho/Oregon border north to the Payette National Forest boundary near the Hells Canyon Recreation Area; then easterly along the Payette National Forest northern boundary (except for BLM land parcels managed by the Cottonwood Field Office) to the Frank Church River of No Return Wilderness boundary; then southerly then westerly along the Wilderness boundary to the intersection of the Butte/Blain county line; then southerly along the county line to Highway 20/26/93; then westerly along Highway 20 to Dixie, Idaho; then northwest along the south fork of the Boise River until it meets Highway 21; then southwest on Highway 21 to Barber, Idaho; then northwest along Highway 44 turning north on Highway 55 east of Eagle; then north on Highway 55 to Horseshoe Bend; then west on Highway 52; then north on Four-Mile Road just south of Sweet, Idaho; follow Four-Mile Road north to just north of Indian Valley; then southwest on Highway 95 to the beginning point in Weiser, Idaho.

Area 2

Starting at Weiser, Idaho follow the Idaho/Oregon border south; then follow the Snake River southeast to King Hill; then go east along Highway 84 to the Bliss, Idaho, turnoff; then go north on Highway 137 to Hill City, Idaho; then westerly along Highway 20 to Dixie, Idaho; then northwest along the south fork of the Boise River until it meets Highway 21; then southwest on Highway 21 to Barber, Idaho; then northwest along Highway 44 turning north on Highway 55 just east of Eagle; then north on Highway 55 to Horseshoe Bend; then west on Highway 52; then north on Four-Mile Road just south of Sweet, Idaho, follow Four-Mile Road north to just north of Indian Valley; then southwest on Highway 95 to the beginning point in Weiser, Idaho.

Area 3

Starting in the southwest corner of the state of Idaho, north along the Idaho/Oregon border to the Snake River; then southeast along the Snake River to the State Highway 21 bridge; then south along the Bruneau River to the Idaho/Nevada border; then due west along the Idaho/Nevada border to the beginning point at the southwest corner of Idaho.

Area 4

Starting at Bliss, Idaho follow I-84 east to Highway 24 (Rupert turnoff); then north on Highway 24 to Minidoka; then north on the Arco/Minidoka road to Arco, Idaho; then west on Highway 20 to Hill City, Idaho; then due south on Highway 137 to the beginning point at Bliss, Idaho.

Area 5

Starting where the Bruneau River flows into Idaho at the Idaho/Nevada border, north along the Bruneau River to the Snake River, then east along the Snake River to King Hill; then east along Highway 84 to American Falls, Idaho; thence south on Highway 37 to Holbrook, Idaho; then south from Holbrook to Stone, Idaho on a two-track dirt road; then due south from Stone, Idaho to the state line; then due west on the Idaho/Utah border and then the Idaho/Nevada border to the beginning point where the Bruneau River flows into Idaho.

Area 6

Beginning at American Falls, Idaho, go northeast on I-86 to just north of Rigby, Idaho; then turn southeast on Highway 26 following it to the Idaho/Wyoming border; then due south to the southeast corner of the state of Idaho; then due west along the Idaho/Utah state line; at a point due south of Stone, Idaho, on the Idaho state line, go due north to Stone, Idaho then north on a two-track road from Stone, Idaho to Holbrook, Idaho; then follow Highway 37 north to the beginning point of American Falls.

Area 7

Beginning at Dubois, Idaho go southwest on Highway 22; turn northwest on Highway 28 to Willow Creek; advance north up Willow Creek to the Idaho/Montana state line; follow the Idaho/Montana state line east until it meets the northwest border of Yellowstone National Park in Idaho; follow the Yellowstone National Park boundary into Wyoming then south until it meets with the Idaho state line; follow the Idaho/Wyoming state line to Highway 26 near Alpine, Idaho; follow Highway 26 northeast to St. Anthony, Idaho; travel due west from St. Anthony to the Red Road turnoff; go north on Red Road to Idmon, Idaho; west on the Spencer Kilgore road to Spencer, Idaho; then south on I-15 to the beginning point at Duboise, Idaho.

Area 8

Beginning at the I-84 turnoff to Rupert, Idaho, go north on Highway 24 through Rupert, Idaho to Minidoka, Idaho; follow the Arco/Minidoka road north to Arco, Idaho; turn northeast on Highway 22/33 and follow it to Duboise, Idaho; travel north on I-15 to Spencer, Idaho; go east on the Spencer/Kilgore Road to Idmon, Idaho; go south on the Red Road to St. Anthony; turn southwest and follow I-86 until it turns into I-84 and reaches the beginning point at the I-84 turnoff to Rupert, Idaho.

Area 9

Starting at Arco, Idaho, travel west on Highway 20/26/90 to the Butte/Blaine County line; follow this county line north to the Salmon-Challis National Forest (SCF) administrative boundary; follow the SCF administrative boundary northwest to the Frank Church River of No Return Wilderness (FCRNR) boundary; go north and east along the FCRNR/SCF boundary to the Idaho/Montana border; follow the Idaho/Montana border southeast to Willow Creek; follow Willow Creek south to Highway 28; follow Highway 28 south to Highway 22; follow Highway 22 southwest to the beginning point of Arco, Idaho.

Area 10

Area 10 comprises all public lands within the Frank Church River of No Return (FCRNR), Gospel Hump and Selway-Bitterroot Wilderness Areas. The FCRNR wilderness, with over 2 million acres, includes the Salmon, Middle Fork Salmon and part of the Selway Wild and Scenic River and major parts of Big Creek and South Fork of the Salmon River, which are potential Wild and Scenic River candidates. The area includes parts of five counties; Custer, Idaho, Lemhi and Valley in Idaho and Ravalli County in Montana; and is administered by five National Forests: Bitterroot and Nezperce of Region 1 and the Boise, Salmon-Challis and Payette of Region 4. The Gospel Hump wilderness at over 206,000 acres is administered by the Clearwater-Nezperce National Forest and is found within Idaho County. The Selway-Bitterroot (SBW) is 1.3 million acres in size. The SBW straddles the Bitterroot mountain range along the Idaho and Montana border. It includes large parts of the Lochsa and Selway River drainages in Idaho and a portion of the western Bitterroot River drainage in Montana. The wilderness is found within Clearwater and Idaho Counties in Idaho and Ravalli and Missoula County in Montana.
