

Bayhorse Trails

The Bayhorse area is situated along the Salmon River and provides a variety of opportunities including fishing, boating and ATVing.



Location—Challis Area



Directions to trailhead: Bayhorse is ten miles south of Challis on Highway 75. Turn onto the Bayhorse Lakes Road and the trails (which are old mining roads) begin off this road.

ATV trails in this area are generally old mining roads and can accommodate most ATVs and UTVs.

The Bayhorse Campground is located near the trails and includes: 11 campsites with picnic tables and fire-rings, seasonal campground host, potable water, vault toilets, garbage collection, interpretive panels, concrete boat ramp and a day use parking area.

These trails are generally open from May to October, depending on weather conditions.




To get to the Bayhorse area travel approximately 11 miles south of Challis on Highway 75. Turn north-west onto the Bayhorse road and follow the signs to Bayhorse Lakes and Townsite.
