

# Backcountry Byway

The Lewis & Clark Back Country Byway is a 36 mile loop drive through mountains, evergreen forest, high desert canyons and grassy foothills.



## Location—Salmon Area



Directions: Follow Highway 58 southeast of Salmon about 22 miles to Tendoy. In the town of Tendoy signs are posted for the Lewis and Clark Backcountry Byway.

The trail follows the Lewis & Clark National Historic Trail and part of the Continental Divide National Scenic Trail.

It is generally open from May to November, depending on trail conditions due to weather. This route is also open for snowmobiles during the winter season.

This route is old roads and can accommodate ATVs and UTVs, including high clearance vehicles. Toilets can be found at Sharkey Hot Springs and Agency Creek Campground, which is in the area.
