

Stinking Springs Trail

Stinking Springs Multiple Use Trail is a designated route for ATVs, hikers, mountain bikers and horseback riders. Here you will view the South Fork of the Snake River along with a national forest.



Location—Idaho Falls Area



Directions: From Idaho Falls, travel northeast on Highway 26, approximately 20 miles. Turn left onto 160th East following the signs to Kelly Canyon Ski Area or Heise Hot Springs. Once you cross the bridge over the Snake River, turn right and continue towards Kelly Canyon. Exit at Snake River Road, following along the north bank of the Snake River for approximately two miles. You will see the parking area on the right side of the road with signs for Stinking Springs Trailhead.

This area is seasonally closed due to crucial mule deer wintering habitat, from November 30 to May 1. Width requirement for this trail is 50 inches or less.


The area is known for its mule deer habitat along with desert hiking within sparse timbered canyons, continuing through the forest.

There are no facilities at the trailhead other than a large parking area and loading ramp for ATVs. This area also has a non-motorized trail.
