

# Pennal Gulch Trail

This 6 mile (one way) winding old jeep trail takes you along the foothills of the Pahsimeroi range on the east side of the Salmon River.



## Location—Challis Area



Directions to trailhead: From Challis travel 3 miles southwest on US 93 to Spring Road, turn left. Go 3 1/2 miles to the trailhead which is located adjacent to the BLM Wild Horse Corrals.

This trail is great for ATVs, motorcycles and mountain bikes. Your chances of seeing mule deer, antelope and big horn sheep are better than you might expect, so ride slow and be on the lookout.


Facilities at the trailhead include vault toilet.

The trail is generally open from May to October, depending on weather conditions. Width limit for this trail is 48 inches or less.



To get to the trail head, travel south of Challis on Highway 93. At Spring Rd turn north. Follow Spring Road for approximately 3.3 miles onto Friday Spring Road. You will see the parking area and trail head north of the Challis wild horse corrals. ATV users can park at the trailhead near the horse corrals. Follow the yellow highlighted route to the actual trail.
