



Beaches form here on both sides of the river when water levels are low.

French Creek
This creek has been the site of a school, store, post office, and Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) camp. Travelers going from the town of Meadows to mines and ranches crossed a wagon bridge over the Salmon River here from 1892 to 1901, when it blew down.

Scott Creek Drainage
Mr. Knott settled a ranch about 1 mile up from the river and sold potatoes to local miners. These potatoes were called 'Knott's Pills'. Knott's Pills were sold with the clay on for 75 cents/pound, but once washed, became half the original size.
