

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

This Congressionally required map is prepared pursuant to the "Omnibus Public Land Management Act of 2009" (the Act), 123 Stat. 991, § 1503(a)(1)(A), dated March 30, 2009, which designates the Big Jacks Creek Wilderness, and according to Bureau of Land Management Manual Section 6120 - *Congressionally Required Maps and Legal Boundary Descriptions for National Conservation System Designations*.

The Big Jacks Creek Wilderness boundary depicted hereon is described in the "Big Jacks Creek Wilderness Legal Boundary Description", also prepared pursuant to the Act. The determination and establishment of the boundary on the ground must be according to the "Big Jacks Creek Wilderness Legal Boundary Description" and the *Manual of Surveying Instructions 2009*.

The surface management agency status ("land ownership") should be used as a general guide only. Official land records, located at the BLM and other offices, should be checked for up-to-date information concerning any specific tract of land.

Roads crossing public lands will be managed pursuant to the Transportation Plan referred to in the Omnibus Public Land Management Act of 2009. Public lands surrounded by private land may not be accessible. Permission is required from private landowners to cross private land, unless access is provided by a Federal, State, or County road, or a BLM road with legal access.
