
Idaho and Southwestern Montana Recreation



Recreation sites and National Historic and Scenic trails are displayed for the Idaho/southwestern Montana sub-region, including BLM and Forest Service lands. Recreational activities, such as riding off-road vehicles (ORV's) and other activities that result in concentrating recreational activities, can result in

disturbances to leks, nesting and brood rearing areas, and winter ranges. Updated management of BLM and Forest Service recreational sites in important sage-grouse habitat could reduce potential impacts to the greater sage-grouse.
