<b>Comments</b>	Approximately 70% of the land has been replanted with crested wheatgrass giving it a "checkerboard" appearance. There five stock water reservoirs, 10-12 miles of fence, and numerous vehicle trails with two cattleguards in the southern half. These improvements are visually evident from most locations in the unit and destroy any natural qualities. The area was dropped from further wilderness consideration in the August 1979 Final Decision.

This boundaries of this unit are mainly defined by surrounding State and private lands. The Sage Road runs along a portion of the east edge and the Eloam Road runs along the west edge.

There are 2 gas wells within this unit which is 59% leased. There are approximately 20 miles of vehicle routes within the unit.

There are portions of 4 grazing allotments within this unit. The 1979 evaluation lists 5 stockwater reservoirs, 10-12 miles of fence, and 2 cattleguards.

Approximately 70% of the unit has been replanted with crested wheatgrass giving it a "checkerboard" appearance.

Topography is rolling hills and glaciated plains with occasional deep coulees. Vegetation consists of prairie grasses and, predominantly, crested wheatgrass.
