Snow Reservoir, which is a popular recreational fishing site, is located within the southern portion of the inventory unit. There is a maintained access route to the reservoir.

Portions of 2 grazing allotments overlap the unit which has approximately 2 miles of interior fence and several miles of vehicle routes used mainly by permittees and hunters.

The area north of Timber Creek Hill Bypass receives heavy use by hunters in the fall and several fire rings have been established. BLM has begun providing a portable public toilet in the fall due to the high use of the area and surrounding lands by hunters on public and Block Management lands.

During team review, the inventory unit was determined to not meet the apparent naturalness criteria of wilderness characteristics for the above reasons in conjunction with its relatively small size.
