This area contains over 5,000 acres of contiguous BLM-administered lands.

The boundaries of this inventory unit are delineated by the Triple Crossing Access Road to the south, Ridge Road to the west, and Burnett Spur Road and Arrambide Road to the north and east. There are 4 State and 1 private inholding within the unit.

Description (include land ownership, location, topography, vegetation, and summary of major human uses/activities):

This unit contains a water spreader system on the north end and there are many reservoirs (some very large) throughout with access routes leading to them. The topography of the area is relatively flat and the reservoirs are highly visible from most vantage points.

Portions of 2 grazing allotments with approximately 16 miles of interior fence overlap the unit.

There are 31 mining claims (bentonite) within the area.

During team review, the inventory unit was determined to not meet the apparent naturalness criteria of wilderness characteristics for the above reasons. Even with the relatively large size of the inventory area, the man-made features are spread throughout and visible from within most of the unit. The boundary roads are maintained and well-traveled almost year-round.
