

Angel Peak is Public Lands Day Site

The Bureau of Land Management's Farmington Field Office is seeking volunteers to help make improvements to Angel Peak Scenic Area from 8:30 a.m. to noon on Saturday, October 2nd, as part of National Public Lands Day celebrations in San Juan County.

Volunteers will receive a t-shirt, a Mexican buffet lunch catered to Angel Peak, and a free pass to any national park in the United States.

National Public Lands Day is held each year at hundreds of sites throughout the country so citizens can volunteer for projects to enhance public lands.

Angel Peak Scenic Area is about 15 miles south of Bloomfield.

Projects at Angel Peak will include improvements to trail and picnic table shelters (spreading fine gravel on trails and around the picnic shelters), building a post and cable fence and painting fence posts and a guard rail along a parking area.
