




Planning Area and Field Office Surface Administration



The 4.2 million acre planning area is comprised of federal, state, and private lands as well as Indian reservations overlying the Mancos/Gallup formations within portions of San Juan, Rio Arriba, McKinley, and Sandoval Counties in New Mexico. The decision area for the RMP Amendment/EIS includes only the surface land and subsurface mineral estate within the planning area for which the BLM has authority to make land use and management decisions.

To aid in cohesive management across the Mancos/Gallup formations, the BLM is completing a Reasonable Foreseeable Development scenario (RFD) across a 6.2 million-acre RFD analysis area extending into portions of the BLM Taos and Rio Puerco Field Offices as well as some tribal and US Forest Service-managed surface outside the FFO.
