

NOTE TO MAP USERS

The surface and mineral resources are published as general planning and management tools. Some of the lands, surface and mineral rights, may have been shown as quarry, gravel pit, or strip mine. The official land records in the respective offices of the Bureau of Land Management or other responsible Federal agencies should be checked for up-to-date status on any specific tract of land. Inadequacies in the BLM maps should be reported to the respective Bureau of Land Management office from which the maps were obtained.

PUBLIC ACCESS

Roads crossing public lands may be traveled by the public unless closed by signage or notice by the land management agency. Public lands traversed by private lands may not have public access. Permission is required from the private landowner to cross private land, unless access is provided by a Federal, State, or County road, or a BLM road with legal access.
