



# Public Scoping Meetings

## Lobos CO2 Pipeline Project

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) is hosting a series of public scoping meetings to solicit comments on the proposed Kinder Morgan Lobos CO2 Pipeline. The proposed 214-mile pipeline would originate in Apache County in eastern Arizona and terminate in Torrance County, New Mexico, with four pump stations located along the proposed route. A new pump station would also be added to the existing Cortez Pipeline in Torrance County, New Mexico, along with a 40-mile long loop in Chaves County, New Mexico, which would be constructed parallel to the Cortez Pipeline. The project would be constructed on about 773-acres of federal land managed by the BLM. A Notice of Intent to Prepare an Environmental Impact Statement was published in the Federal Register on October 31, 2013.

All interested parties are invited to attend the public scoping meetings to learn about the federal review process and discuss the details of the proposed project.
