Corvus Gold Nevada Inc. has submitted to the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), Tonopah Field Office (TFO) an Amended Plan of Operations for the North Bullfrog Exploration Project. The amendment consists of an additional 93.4 acres of exploration activities (i.e. drilling, road building, test pits, and monitor wells).

Pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and Council on Environmental Quality regulations for implementing NEPA, the BLM, TFO has prepared an Environmental Assessment (EA) which analyzes the impacts of Corvus Gold Nevada Inc's proposal. The EA evaluates the probable direct, indirect and cumulative impacts associated with the proposal and identifies, describes and evaluates resources protection measures designed to mitigate their effects.

The EA will be available for a 30-day public comment period. Written comments on this EA will be accepted at the above address until 4:30 p.m., April 5, 2013. The EA can be viewed on the BLM Battle Mountain District website at:
