Dear Reader:

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Carson City District, Stillwater Field Offices has issued the Decision Record for the Final Environmental Assessment (EA) for the Clan Alpine, Pilot Mountain and Pine Nut Herd Management Areas (HMAs) Gather Plan, DOI-BLM-NV-C010-2010-0019-EA. The decision is for the BLM to implement the Proposed Action Alternative to gather approximately 346 wild horses from the Pilot Mountain HMA, vaccinate approximately 76 mares with a two year fertility control vaccine and remove approximately 53 excess wild horses (within the HMA) and another 104 wild horses from associated non-HMA areas. One hundred eighty nine (189) wild horses will be released back into the Pilot Mountain HMA. The gather is expected to begin in late November, 2010 and will take eleven days to complete.

An EA was made available to the public for a 30-day review period and written comments were received from over 7,500 individuals, three State agencies, and numerous organizations. Refer to Appendix G of the Final EA for the distinct topics of the comments, and responses.

The gather and impacts are described and analyzed in the Final EA. A determination has been made that implementation of the Proposed Action would not result in "significant environmental impacts," therefore a Finding of No Significant Impact has been prepared separately to document that determination, and a Decision Record has been issued providing the rationale for approving The Proposed Action Alternative.
