PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

Bear Tracks on My Bed: Kids Quilting- What do bears, turkey tracks, and log cabins have in common? They are represented on quilts. Learn about pioneers by the patterns they left behind. Create your own paper quilt block that represents life on the trail. *1 hour*

Clothes Pin Dolls for Kids: Girls often took a doll with them on their journey west. Emigrant Patty Reed clutched a small doll during her long trip. Learn about Patty's trip with the Donner Party and how this little doll helped her through the long trip and horrible winter. After, kids can make their own clothes pin doll using needle and thread. Ages 7 and up *30 minutes*

From Sheep to Shawl: Fiber Arts -Experience the beauty and diversity of fiber arts. Demonstrations include spinning, loom weaving, quilting, felting, knitting, and crochet. Visitors will be able to participate in hands-on activities as well as learn how wool is processed and made into beautiful and practical hand-made items. *4 hours*

Happy Birthday, Elko! Celebrate Elko's birthday by learning about it's vibrant past. Hear stories about the community and share your own. *1 hour*

Kids Christmas at the Trail Center - Listen to pioneer Christmas stories followed by craft. Create your own tin lantern, or ornament, and design a paper quilt block for display at the Trail Center. *2 hours*

Pioneer Children's Games - Have fun playing with old-fashioned toys as you learn about the different games pioneer children played. *30 minutes*

A Pioneer Christmas Story - Listen to a story about pioneers helping each other at Christmas. Afterwards, make a special Christmas card to take home. *1 hour*

Shoshone Games-Come out and learn how to play traditional Shoshone games while learning about the Shoshone culture. *1 hour*

Shoshone: A Walk Through Time - For thousands of years, the Shoshone have lived off the land. Join James Hedrick to discover how traditions and culture have changed over time and how modern Shoshone continue to thrive in today's world. *30 minutes*

9:30 Forgotten Journey - In 1844 the Oregon Trail was full of farm families moving west. But, that summer one party set out on its own, heading into unknown wilderness and blazing a trail to California. *60 minutes*

1:00 Forty Mile Desert - For pioneers, the Forty Mile Desert was one of the most dangerous sections of their journey West. Discover the hardships of this perilous crossing. *30 minutes*

3:30 Golden Spike - Witness the exciting story of the Transcontinental Railroad. The Union Pacific, starting out of Nebraska Territory, and the Central Pacific out of California, raced relentlessly toward one another to join at Promontory Summit, Utah Territory on May 10, 1869. *20 minutes*
