

Dead Pinyon Pine, Juniper and Mahogany are available for cutting anywhere on BLM land except and unless an area is a Wilderness Study, campground, or posted for "No Firewood Cutting" to allow for grass seeding rehabilitation. Live trees may only be cut in designated greenwood harvest areas.

## **STIPULATIONS** **FOR DOMESTIC WOOD CUTTERS**

1. A permit must be in possession while harvesting and transporting firewood. In addition, a permit is only valid when used by the purchaser or an immediate family member.
2. A permit is only valid for the species of wood listed on the permit. Cutting and/or removing aspen, fir, limber or bristlecone pine is prohibited unless otherwise authorized in writing.
3. Stump height will be less than six inches, with all live limbs removed. Remaining slash should be left scattered.
4. All slash shall be removed from drainages.
5. In selective greenwood cut areas, no trees under six inches in diameter shall be cut.
6. Individual trees marked "wildlife habitat tree" shall not be cut.
7. No cutting is authorized within 50 feet of main access or county roads.
8. Littering is forbidden. All refuse brought into an area must be hauled out.
9. Wood harvest is not allowed within any forest enhancement project area. Forest enhancement areas are currently located on Spruce, Dolly Varden, and the Cherry Creeks.
10. Travel on roads, other than paved, is restricted when the roads are not dry, firm, or frozen. New roads may not be created for access.
11. All chainsaws will be equipped with a functional spark arrester.
12. Each wood cutter is required to have a shovel and/or fire extinguisher on hand in the cutting area.
13. No open fires will be allowed during periods of high fire danger.
14. Prior to transporting firewood, permittee shall enter the amount and date in the permittees record of firewood removal.
15. Permittee shall punch out the appropriate day and month on the load ticket(s) and attach the ticket(s) in a visible location on the rear of the load prior to exiting the cutting area.

## GENERAL INFORMATION ON FIREWOOD CUTTING AREAS

1. ELKO SLECTIVE GREENWOOD CUT – INDIAN WELL

30 miles southwest from Elko to the cut area. 18 miles of pavement to twin bridge turnoff and 12 miles of dirt road. Good access into the area, however, the road becomes very soft and dusty. Only 2-wheel drive is necessary in dry conditions. Juniper is the only tree available for cutting in this area.

2. WELLS SELECTIVE GREENWOOD CUT – WOOD HILLS

61 miles east-northeast from Elko to the cut area. 11 miles east from Wells to the cut area. 2.3 miles of dirt road. Good access into the area. Only 2-wheel drive is necessary in dry conditions. Species of trees available for cutting include: Pinyon pine, juniper and some Mountain mahogany.

3. CHARLEY CANYON SELECTIVE GREENWOOD CUT

10 miles west-northwest from Montello to the cut area. All is on dirt road. Good access into the area, only 2-wheel drive is necessary in dry conditions. Species of trees available include: Pinyon pine, juniper and some Mountain mahogany.

4. MORGAN BASIN SELECTIVE GREENWOOD CUT

14 southwest miles from Wendover to the cut area. There is about 7 miles of pavement and 7 miles of dirt road. Good access to the area, only 2-wheel drive is necessary in dry conditions. However, parts of the road are rocky and steep which could restrict a 2-wheel drive to certain locations. Species of trees available for cutting include: Pinyon pine, juniper and some Mountain mahogany.
