Project Description:

The proposed property acquisition identified for Phase-1, is commonly known as the Ballardini Ranch and consists of 121.26 acres of the "up to 250 acres" as described in the White Pine County Lands Bill legislation. The Ranch is situated in southwest Reno, off McCarran Boulevard. Located in the lower transition zone of the Carson Range, the property is characterized as sagebrush steppe, supporting sagebrush and bitterbrush plant communities, irrigated pastures, with higher slopes of Jeffery and Ponderosa pines. A large portion of the property is located within the Evans Creek watershed and includes riparian areas, springs, and natural wetlands supporting a diverse variety of wildlife and aquatic species including mule deer, black bear, bobcat and mountain lion.

This project will consist of the design and construction of an ADA accessible pedestrian bridge across the I-15 (near Gowan Rd.) for the Las Vegas Wash Regional Trail System. This is a critical component for the connectivity of the regional trail that will provide fluid access for trail users from the City's Upper and Lower Wash Trails (north and northwest of the I-15) to the future Cheyenne Peaking Basin Park and the Las Vegas Wash Regional Trail System southeast of the I 15.

Project Description:

The Green Valley Flood Control Channel Restoration will restore approximately 1/2 mile of an existing channel overgrown with weed and tamarisk shrub and occupied by litter from the Selma Bartlett Elementary School near I-215 to Sandwedge Drive. The channel continues from Sandwedge to the Greenspun Junior High School northward to the Pittman Wash and the UPRR corridor, linking several public facilities to otherwise disconnected neighborhoods.

The project includes the re-vegetation of the channel and the restoration of an existing maintenance road to allow for dual trail use to ensure aesthetic quality and safety for trail users. The flows originally designed for this flood control facility have been reduced due to the development of upstream detention basins. This project will provide an attractive and safe trail experience that offers an opportunity for the residents of the surrounding neighborhoods to enjoy the desert environment. The trail will connect neighborhoods to the Mountain View Park and the Selma Bartlett Elementary School.

The restoration will include the following re-vegetation with native and desert adapted plant species in the area designated re-vegetation and installation of desert varnish on existing riprap; removal of non-native and/or invasive plant materials; installation of erosion protected vegetation along channel; the installation of connecting pathways to neighborhoods where available; the installation of benches and way-finding signage; and lighting in residential neighborhoods. Additionally, the project will include the installation of safety rails as required by American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO).

Project Description:

This project will construct equestrian trails and connections in four Rural Neighborhood Preservation (RNP) areas in the Northwest and Southwest portions of the Las Vegas Valley, including trails on County land associated with the Western Trails Equestrian Park, and a minor trail connector segment located in Section 7 T22S R61E MDM which is not within an RNP. This project is intended to provide unique recreational opportunities for the equestrian enthusiasts who live in and near the RNP's; while also providing connections to existing equestrian trails systems, connections to parks where equestrian facilities are currently located or planned, and potential connections between RNP areas. Segments of the equestrian trails will include mostly permanent trails with some short-term PTNA projects as defined in the SNPLMA Implementation Agreement. Most of the trails will be dirt/graveled trails with signage located within the existing road right-of-way built to rural standards (i.e., 24 to 30 feet of asphalt with no curb, gutter or sidewalk). Some trails may be a little more elaborate, with some fencing, horse gates, and defined riding paths located on land owned by Clark County. The entire project includes approximately 30 miles of trail. It is anticipated the funding for Phase 1 will construct approximately 10-12 miles of trail.

Significant objectives/deliverables include: Numerous equestrian trails along roads in all four RNP areas; More extensive trails in the RNP area associated with the Western Trails Equestrian Park; Safe crossing areas on streets that may include crossing signals, crossing flashers, and low impact equestrian crossings where traffic is minimal; Dust control measures (where required); Connectivity to parks, existing equestrian trails, and other RNP's to provide numerous opportunities for equestrian enthusiasts.

A pedestrian bridge is proposed to connect two trailhead projects approved in Round 6, Sandhill/Owens Park & Trailhead - Private Land (SNPLMA 6-8, 6-16) and City Owned Land (SNPLMA 6-19). These trailheads are located across from each other on opposite sides of the Las Vegas Wash and along the Las Vegas Wash Trail Phase 1 (SNPLMA 3-12) approved in Round 3. The bridge will provide a pedestrian connection for the Sandhill/Owens Private Land parcel and the residents on that side of the channel to reach the Las Vegas Wash Trail. The bridge is anticipated to be at least a 200-foot span in order to keep the bridge footings out of the channel flood level waters. On the east side of the Wash, the bridge touches down onto a 1/4-acre City-owned parcel that is not part of the Sandhill/Owens Park & Trailhead. The bridge project includes the development of the parcel.

This Round 8 project proposal is requesting funds to fabricate and install interpretive exhibits in and around the Clark County Wetlands Park Nature Center (Interpretive Facility), currently in design, that was funded in Round 5 (BLM5-5). The County and the Nature Center architect are presently working together with an interpretive exhibit planner to design the exhibits. The exhibits will constitute the first and most comprehensive educational experience with the wetlands and upper Mojave Desert for the visitor; and will tell stories of the human history, biological and animal communities, hydrology, geology, aesthetics and ecology of the Las Vegas Wash. The early childhood exhibits will feature greater than life size native animals and birds in cast-concrete or other suitable materials with educational messages appropriate to ages 3-12.

This project consists of the Phase II Development of the 135-acre Craig Ranch Regional Park, which is located northwest of Craig Road and Commerce Street. This park was funded for acquisition in SNPLMA Rounds 4 & 5, as well as Phase I Design and Development in SNPLMA Round 5. Phase II will feature significant objectives and deliverables, which may include: Naturalistic water features; Tree preservation; Outdoor performance venue; Group picnic areas; Youth Baseball Fields; Basketball, tennis & volleyball courts; Skatepark; Maintenance Facility; Internal trail system w/ direct connection to the Regional Trail; Interpretive & educational signage; Playgrounds; Dog Park; Park amenities & infrastructure; Central Plaza; Native Gardens.

This park is of regional value and will serve a range of user groups including, but not limited to, nature enthusiasts, amateur botanists, trail users, bicyclists, skaters, family groups, social groups, students, youth and/or adult sports, and dog owners.

Project Description:

The City of Las Vegas and the State of Nevada entered into an agreement to transfer the ownership and maintenance of the Park from the State to the City. As part of the agreement, a Master Plan was developed to help guide the conservation and redevelopment of the Park property. One of the critical elements of the Master Plan is for the restoration of existing trails within the Park core and the development of new multi-use trails throughout the natural areas of the park. The Master Plan also identified two Environmental Enhancement Areas within the Park property which are intended to preserve the natural environment and provide passive recreational trails. These Environmental Enhancement Areas will also include regional flood control detention basins which will protect downstream properties from flash flooding which can frequently occur in the Northwest. Currently, the City of Las Vegas is developing a design for the Southern Environmental Enhancement Area which includes approximately 3 miles of trails with associated amenities. The deliverables of this project includes: Decomposed Granite Trail (12-foot wide) with concrete curb edges; 2-foot wide decomposed granite shoulders; Concrete Benches; Trail Signage; Wayfinding Kiosks; and Lighting.

This project consists of the acquisition of 2.32-acres of land at Lake Mead Boulevard and Tonopah Avenue, along the boundary of the City of North Las Vegas and the City of Las Vegas. The project site is currently raw land that is bordered by intense multi-family and commercial development. The site will be developed as a community garden/botanical site and a recreation center. Gardening, horticultural activities and recreational services will become available to residents of this community that is generally underserved by parks. The projected amenities will unite families and neighbors. It will foster inter-generational relationships, a healthy environment and educational classes. This "natural area" initiative will begin much needed revitalization, socialization, unity and neighborhood pride. Additionally, a recreational facility will facilitate such programming as: arts, crafts, tutoring, adult education, horticulture, composting, recycling, landscaping, cooking, exercising, budgeting, career planning, and goal setting. The recreational facility will serve as a meeting place for seniors, youths, the general population, service providers and neighborhood association groups.

Project Description:

The Made-in-the-Shade program will bring play areas at City parks into compliance with federal guidelines for playground amenities through the addition of shade structures above all playground equipment and the installation of safety surfacing (rubberized, non-skid) under play areas. The program is based on Consumer Product Safety Commission and American Society for Testing and Materials standards, with the primary purpose of providing needed shade for children using play equipment. There is a recognized need for shaded playgrounds in the Las Vegas valley, an area of the country that has temperatures in excess of 110 degrees during summer months and over 300 days of sunshine.

The project will also include upgrades to the existing playground equipment, including swings and related park amenities. The Made-in-the-Shade program specifically targets 30 of the City's 43 existing parks for improvements. The level of improvement needed varies according to the needs of each park. The specific deliverables for each project vary according to the needs of each park. The deliverables will include items such as: Addition of shade structures above all playground equipment; Installation of safety surfacing (rubberized, non-skid surface) under all play areas; Addition of guardrails and protective bars for elevated surfaces such as platforms, ramps, and bridgeways to prevent accidental falls; Installation of upgraded swings to a softer material, where applicable.

Addition of upgraded slides to meet safety standards; Installation of upgraded seesaws to meet safety standards; Removal of dangerous equipment such as rings and trapeze bars, protruding bolt ends or openings (such as between ladder rungs) to remove spaces that could trap children; removal of sharp points or edges in equipment; and tripping hazards, such as tree stumps, rocks, and concrete protrusions.

Deliverables of this project nomination include: replacing and adding to the current bleachers at the ball field; refurbishing the lighting in the whole park including field lighting; improving the picnic area including outdoor cooking facilities; re-roofing the engine display; enlarging the concession stand/restroom building; replacing the playground equipment with new state of the art equipment; re-fencing the entire park; upgrading the announcers stand for the ball field; and flood control at the parking area including a retaining wall.

This project would take advantage of land given to the Town, on the east side, for use as a park. The Town of Panaca expects to grow due to the Lincoln County Land Act provision of the Towns being able to convert BLM land for development. With Panaca' intended use of some of this land for an industrial park, and the planned development of the Lincoln County Airport that is located just west of Panaca, it is possible that the town could grow even faster than Pioche to the north. The current park does not provide enough facilities for the residents now. It is small and fills up readily. Panaca is a very family oriented town, and outdoor recreation is very important to the residents. Also, the location of the new park would give highway travelers the ability to stop and take advantage of the picnic area and restrooms and enjoy the peaceful surroundings of an historic town such as Panaca.

Deliverables of this project nomination include: covered picnic areas; playground equipment; restrooms; outdoor cooking facilities including a group barbecue pit; zero-scape landscaping; lighting; paved walkways and jogging areas; fencing; parking area; access road.
