





Socioeconomics

PIPELINE CONSTRUCTION AND OPERATIONS

- Moves south-to-north over ~12-years
- Temporary jobs:
 - Direct: ~930 peak
 - Indirect: ~530 peak
- Many jobs filled by Clark County and non-Nevada residents
- Demand for housing likely exceeds supply in rural areas
- Construction worker housing facility(ies) may be developed



- Short-term local economic benefits; minor adverse effects on grazing, hunting, recreation
- Short-term demand on public services, e.g., law enforcement, emergency medical, and road & bridge
- Social changes already occurring
- Substantial sales & use taxes on material and consumer purchases
- Limited long-term economic benefits from operation

FUTURE FACILITIES DEVELOPMENT

- Wells developed in up to 5 basins, involving as many as 4 individual phases
- Smaller scale effects compared to pipeline construction
- Jobs: 100 - 140 / phase
- Temporary population gains and housing demand
- Short-term local economic boost
- Short-term demand on public services
- Positive temporary effect on local sales and use tax revenue
- Limited long-term economic benefits
