### **Bifid duct pyrg**

**Habitat:** Turnley, Big Sprung (Snake Valley) and 6 springs in Millard County, Utah. It may also occur in Rock and two unnamed springs near Turnley Spring.

- Turnley Spring: 39 09' 41.7"N 114 21' 11.6"W 6723'



**Ownership:** From the maps I have it appears to straddle the property line of Private land and the BLM.

### **Observed threats:**

- Water diversions
- Cattle
- Contamination
- SNWA ground water water development project
- Inadequate regulatory mechanisms.

According to the BLM DEIS for the SNWA project, the bifid duct springsnail, “may be extirpated from this site”. I found snails to be easily observed. The spring head has been excavated, likely

leading to the increased flows. The area still looks trashed and made-made diversions and litter are evident.
