Dear Laurie:

After reviewing the preliminary field report for site [REDACTED] (testing and excavation), our
archaeologist believes that no additional archaeological investigations are needed to mitigate the
effects of pipeline construction through this area.

The cultural resources and cultural values that would make [REDACTED] eligible for the National
Register of Historic Resources have been recovered. Therefore, this site is no longer eligible for
the Register.

The construction may proceed. However, if further ground disturbing activities uncover and
disturb significant cultural material, work must stop and the findings evaluated by a Fremont-
Winema National Forest archeologist or Ruby contracted archaeologist.
