Wild Horse Adoption

Northern Nevada Correctional Center — Carson City, Nevada

18 studs and 12 mares were held after the February 2013 Diamond Complex gather for potential release this spring. An inventory flight in July 2013 shows population/herd health is no longer an issue since more wild horses exist in the Complex than predicted, based upon winter conditions, lack of forage and poor body condition. As a result, the Diamond 30 (which has grown to 38) will be offered for adoption, and sale rather than released.

- The horses available for adoption or sale include 18 adult geldings, 11 adult mares, 4 gelded colts and 5 fillies.
- All horses have been vaccinated, dewormed, and Coggins tested. A veterinarian and brand inspector will be on site at the event.
- Adoption event scheduled for September 28, 2013 at the Northern Nevada Correctional Center.
- Horses 11 years of age and older will be offered for sale, and those 10 and under will be offered for adoption.

- The adoptions would be conducted through Competitive Bid. Base adoption fee is \$125.
