The Moab Field Office of the Bureau of Land Management and the Moab/Monticello Ranger District of the Manti-La Sal National Forest are initiating a 30-day public comment period on an environmental assessment (EA) regarding the impacts of Denison Mines La Sal Mines Complex Plan of Operations Amendment to expand the Pandora Mine's Waste Rock Pile and other mining related operations in accordance with their rights established by the General Mining Law of 1872 as amended and federal regulations for locatable mining operations at 43 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Section 3809 and 36 CFR Section 228 Subpart A. The La Sal Mines Complex is located east of the town of La Sal in San Juan County and encompasses public lands under the regulatory jurisdiction of the US Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and the Manti-La Sal National Forest.

The public review and comment period for the EA will begin on the publication date of this notice and will end on August 6, 2012.
