BLM Announces Improvements to Hittle Bottom Boat Ramp and Campground

Moab, Utah—The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Utah Moab Field Office is excited to announce that construction will soon begin on improvements to the Hittle Bottom Boat Ramp and Campground located along Highway 128. There are a number of improvements being made that will greatly improve the experience for boaters and campers at Hittle Bottom, including:

- A one-way route will be constructed to improve boat ramp access and additional parking will be added for vehicles and boat trailers;
- The Hittle Bottom reservable group camp site will be relocated to an area upstream from the boat ramp area;
- An additional vault toilet and new parking will be installed to serve the relocated group site; and
- One additional individual site will be added to the 12 existing individual campsites.

The BLM anticipates that the improvements at Hittle Bottom will be finished in the spring. The Hittle Bottom improvement project is an example of local recreation fees at work to provide outstanding experiences and facilities for Moab recreationists.
