

Reserved Campsite Map

Camping below Government Rapid camp (~mile 64) is allowed at nine designated sites only. These camps may not be shared by more than one party. Review the instructions on the "Reserved Campsite Request Form" when planning your camps.

A permit is required from the Navajo Nation to camp at Slickhorn E or to hike in Oljeto Wash. Call the Navajo Parks and Recreation Dept. at (928) 871-6647 or visit their website <http://navajonationparks.org/permits.htm> for permit information.

Campsites at Grand Gulch, Trimble, Oljeto Wash, and Steer Gulch are located at the mouths of drainages and can experience flash floods during rainy weather; exercise caution. Make sure your campsite has safe areas of higher ground and is out of the path of flash floods. BLM doesn't recognize the beach area at the mouth of Oljeto Wash as part of the camp; if you reserve Oljeto Wash, exercise caution if camping in the beach area and/or camping with a larger than recommended group.
