Protection of fossils is one function of the BLM. The scientific inquiry done at this quarry is only possible because the fossils have been kept in museum collections along with information about their removal.

The Cleveland-Lloyd Dinosaur Quarry was designated a National Natural Landmark in 1966. The visitor center opened in 1968, and sheds over the Quarry were built in 1976.

The Bureau of Land Management is mandated to sustain the health, diversity and productivity of public lands for the use and enjoyment of present and future generations.

Dinosaur fossils are part of our common heritage. If you find a fossil, it is your responsibility to report it, not take it home. Please help us protect our natural resources so people generations from now can continue to make discoveries.
