Boy Scouts of America Eagle Scout Project Requirements

The Boy Scouts of America have enjoyed over 100 years of outstanding leadership, education and community service. The Bureau of Land Management continues the privilege of working with the BSA and helping provide great and outstanding Eagle Scout projects.

To better prepare and accommodate a new Eagle Scout project, the BLM requires that a project proposal be submitted to the BLM no less than 180 days prior to the projects due date. Project proposals will not be accepted less than 180 days prior to due date.

Project proposals must include the following:

- * Title
- * Project location
- * Proposed project date,
- * Scouts names
- * Scout leader(s) name,
- * A well written description of the project
- * And the benefit to BLM or surrounding communities.

BLM St. George Field Office Policy does not allow Eagle Scout projects for trail construction and maintenance or any type of sign maintenance or installation or any project that carries a high degree of risk to the participant.

Although there are many different types of projects available (fencing, clean up, community service, etc), due to the sheer volume of project requests the BLM does not have a list of available or needed Eagle Scout projects.

If you know of a current project or have an idea for a new project on BLM lands, please submit a proposal.
