### Beaver Dam Mountain Wildlife Guzzlers

This is a Notice of Availability for an Environmental Assessment (EA) prepared to consider the potential environmental impacts associated with the Beaver Dam Mountain Wildlife Guzzlers, located on public lands administered by the BLM, St. George Field Office. Public comments will be accepted during the 15 day review period for this EA. Comments on the EA must be in writing, submitted to the address below, and received by BLM by the close of business on August 19, 2011.

**Information:** The St. George Field Office-BLM in cooperation with the Utah Division of Wildlife Resources are proposing to construction of 23 small wildlife guzzlers and one big game guzzler in the Beaver Dam Mountains located Northwest of St. George Utah. The Utah Division of Wildlife Resources (UDWR) proposes to build three different clusters of small water developments (guzzlers) in the Beaver Dam Mountains area of Washington County and one large Big Game Guzzler on the Gold Strike Mine Reclamation area. The proposal includes a total of 24 sites on BLM land administered by the St. George Field Office. Two sites would be rebuilds of existing guzzlers lost to wildfires and 22 sites are proposed for new guzzler construction. These complexes would be located to enhance existing wildlife waters in the area. The EA discloses the potential impacts to the human environment that could result from this federal action.

This rationale must demonstrate that disclosure would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of privacy. Unsupported assertions will not meet this burden. In the absence of exceptional, documented circumstances, this information will be released. All submissions from organizations*
