Purchaser agrees not to knowingly sell or transfer ownership of any listed wild horse(s) and/or burro(s) to any person or organization with an intention to resell, trade, or give away the animal(s) for processing into commercial products.

Purchaser understands the listed wild horse (s) and/or burro (s) is/are wild, ungente animals, and due to their age and temperament may never become accustomed to human contact or be trainable for handling like domestic livestock.

Purchaser agrees to provide adequate facilities to contain and care for these animals.

Purchaser acknowledges that the seller makes no express or implied warranties as to the merchantability or fitness for any particular purpose for any wild horses or burros purchased under this program.

Purchaser has read the above statements, and understands and agrees to these terms.

Per Public Law 92-195, as amended, the listed wild horse (s) and/or burro (s) "shall no longer be considered to be a wild free-roaming horse or burro." Sale of animals is final upon pick-up and will be the responsibility of the purchaser.
