

# SCA Internship Cost Estimates

The following costs are estimates for SCA Conservation Interns starting between October 1, 2006 and September 30, 2007.

## SCA Provides:

- Recruitment and presentation of pre-qualified applicants based on your job specifications
- Round-trip travel and living allowance (direct payment/reimbursement to Intern)
- Liability and 24-hour accident insurance coverage (longer term Interns are also offered full health insurance)
- Complete customer service support and liaison services between SCA staff and Intern
- AmeriCorps Education Award (as available) at no cost to you
- Vehicle leasing, equipment and training available. Call SCA for details.

## You Provide:

- Internship position(s) that are challenging, educational and include a level of responsibility while also meeting your specific project needs
- Supervision and training appropriate to the position
- Intern housing (or SCA bills agency for Intern's accommodation)
- On-the-job transportation
- Intern evaluation at project completion (form provided by SCA)

For all agencies/organizations above, SCA will submit invoices based on actual costs incurred which may be less than or exceed the estimates listed. Final costs will reflect round-trip travel expenses, length of Internship and amount of living allowance. These estimates do not include any of the costs associated with Intern housing. Should you not have onsite housing available, SCA can manage intern rental payments based on your local housing market. ### SCA Provides:

- Recruitment and training of skilled adult Crew Leaders to supervise the crew and manage, direct and implement the work project(s)
- Recruitment and training of highly motivated high school volunteers, with crews equally comprised of young men and women
- Crew member transportation to/from their respected homes to the public transport terminal nearest your site
- Tents, stoves, food and other equipment necessary to operate base camp
- Administrative support including the issuance of crew expense accounts
- Liability Coverage and Secondary Personal Accident Insurance
- 24 hour emergency response system

### You Provide:

- Work project specifications, tools and required safety equipment
- Radio or cell phone (for crews not near a phone)
- Transportation of the crew to/from the closest public transportation terminal to your site
- On the job transportation (as required) and transportation of food and equipment to base camp and return
- Access to educational resources in the area
- Storage of SCA equipment during the off season (if available)
- Written program evaluation at completion of project
