- (1) The performance goal for FY 2008 was to have 81percent of the BLM's organizational units rated in good safety, health, and environmental condition.
- (2) The above data includes audits performed from October 1993 through June 2008 and responses from the field on the findings from those audits through July 2008.
- (3) FY 2008 is the fourth fiscal year in which an organizational unit must have all its high priority CASHE findings completed to be rated in good condition. This standard has been phased in since FY 2000 when an organizational unit could have up to five high priority findings and be rated in good condition. In each fiscal year since FY 2000, the good condition standard has been reduced by one high priority finding until it reached zero in FY 2005.
- (4) In FY 2009, CASHE Radio audit findings will count towards determining whether an organizational unit is rated in good condition. In FY 2009 an organizational unit must have zero incomplete high priority traditional CASHE findings and five or fewer high priority CASHE Radio findings to be rated in good condition.
