Instead, the agency is

treadmill of pesticide use. Inorganic livestock grazing, unrelated to crop
rotation; careless road
construction and use; use of off-road vehicles for recreation (ugly
pandering to consumption of
products); excess timber harvests, and fuel reduction projects all
encourage invasive weeds on BLM
land. BLM needs to change the way the agency manages these activities in
order to prevent invasive
plant problems. BLM also needs to make a strong commitment to reducing its
reliance on herbicides.
Make a specific measurable commitment to reducing reliance on herbicides.
Consult with all us
communistsocialist environmentalists and others who experiment and research
ways to limit human's
negative effects on Earth.
