


McCullough Peaks Wild Horse Herd Management Area




Stay safe and keep wild horses wild
by following these simple guidelines:

- Visitors to the McCullough Peaks HMA should maintain a distance of at least 300 feet from wild horses.
- Approaching wild horses during the foaling season (February 1st through July 31st) may result in foal abandonment.
- Do not attempt to feed, or touch wild horses and do not engage in activity that interrupts their current behavior.
- Pursuing horses that move away from you because of your presence may be seen as harassment, which is unlawful.
- Control dogs at all times or leave them at home.
- Get your “close-up” by using binoculars, spotting scopes, and telephoto lenses.
- Low clearance vehicles are not recommended on graded dirt roads or two-track trails.
- Be aware Wyoming weather can change quickly. Roads in adverse weather conditions are not recommended for travel.



Vehicle Access To Wild Horse Herd Management Area




