The Decision Record and Finding of No Significant Impact (DR/FONSI), is now complete for the Red Canyon Wild Mustang Tours and Red Canyon River Trips Special Recreation Permit Renewal. The location of the wild horse viewing tours is approximately 15 miles east of Cody, Wyoming, near U.S. Highway 14-16-20 in the McCullough Peaks Wild Horse Herd Management Area. The location of the river trips is approximately 24 miles northwest of Cody, Wyoming, on the Clarks Fork of the Yellowstone River.

A decision has been made to authorize the proposed action, with stipulations as part of the proposed action. Some changes to the proposed action and the stipulations were made as a result of public comment. The stipulations, along with monitoring, have resulted in a FONSI; no environmental impact statement will be prepared.

This Environmental Assessment and subsequent DR/FONSI were prepared pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act and other relevant law and regulation, to fully disclose the anticipated impacts of the proposed action.
