### **INTRODUCTION**

Based on analysis of potential environmental impacts contained in the attached Environmental Assessment (EA) WY-090-EA10-33, I find the Proposed Action to issue grazing permits on the Coyote Hollow (#01419), Fourty (#01448), France (#01565), Johnson (#01420), Nipple (#11313), Thunderbolt (#01429), Tipperary (#11411), Upper Ranch (#11316), and Wall (#01432) allotments with modified terms and conditions will not have a significant impact on the quality of the human environment and therefore conclude that an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) is not required.

### **RATIONALE:**

The Proposed Action is in conformance with applicable land use plans, namely the Kemmerer Resource Management Plan/Final Environmental Impact Statement approved on May 24, 2010, which provides management objectives for the Kemmerer Field Office Area. The Proposed Action also conforms to applicable laws and regulations, such as the Taylor Grazing Act of 1934, the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976, and 43 Code of Federal Regulations parts 4100 to the end. The Proposed Action follows the principles of multiple use and sustained yield by authorizing livestock grazing, but establishing terms and conditions that will minimize impact to the human environment.
