Subject NO to Preferred Alternative C

Dear BLM Office

I am writing to object strongly to the Preferred Alternative C with regard to further development of the Pinedale Anticline gas fields.

Until there has been an independent review of current social, cultural and environmental impacts on existing drilling and activity on BOTH the Jonah and the Anticline, ALL further development must be curtailed.

There cannot be another increase of mineral production without corresponding provisions to protect land; air; water; culture; humans and wildlife. So far, the efforts to protect human health, the environment and cultural values in Sublette County have been almost entirely disregarded in the pursuit of energy development. Air quality has already been negatively affected; the mule deer herd has been reduced by 46%, the impact to the pronghorn antelope herd is as yet unclear but we cannot ignore the fact that on January 7, 2007 22 antelope were killed in a single collision with an oil truck. The health and human services in Pinedale are overloaded as are the schools and hotels. Every other commercial venture - tourism, hunting, agriculture - has been made to step aside for energy development.

Much of Sublette County comprises the southern end of the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem. You have an obligation to ensure that public lands in Sublette County remain open for multiple use. Not, as is currently the case, single use.
