Protest of 14 parcels. Specific parcels protested include: Parcels WY-0812-177, WY-0812-178, WY-0812-179, WY-0812-180, WY-0812-181, WY-0812-182, WY-0812-183, WY-0812-186, WY-0812-187, WY-0812-188, WY-0812-189, WY-0812-190, WY-0812-191 and WY-0812-192.

Dear Director Simpson:

I hereby protest the inclusion of the above referenced parcels in the lease sale advertised by the Bureau of Land Management on October 17<sup>th</sup>, 2008. I request the above parcels be withdrawn from sale because they:

- 1). I do not know why the BLM would offer, or even consider Oil and Gas Exploration on Little Mountain because of what this area has to offer to the public. This area is virtually untouched and is probably one of the most attractive outdoor recreational areas in the State of Wyoming.
- 2). This area offers some of the most sought after Big Game Hunting in the State of Wyoming. This area is a Limited Quota Deer, Elk, and Antelope hunting area with very low odds of drawing a permit to hunt. To go in and blade new roads, have seismic helicopter and hole shot disturbance would further make it harder to hunt and enjoy this area because of the Big Game animals being pushed out of the area.
- 3). I have been camping, hunting, fishing, hiking, and firewood cutting on Little Mountain with my family for the past 38 years while enjoying the undisturbed Wilderness like settings of the area that has the most spectacular views that keeps us coming back time and time again. I sure hope that the right decision is made with the publics best interest first.


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Dear Director Simpson:

I hereby protest the inclusion of the above referenced parcels in the lease sale advertised by the Bureau of Land Management on October 17<sup>th</sup>, 2008. I request the above parcels be withdrawn from sale because they:

- 1). I have been going South of Rock Springs to the Little Mountain area for 38 years now. My mother and father started taking me out to Little Mountain when I was 9 years old. We hunted, fished, camped, firewood cutting, and hiking. Now I take my wife and son to Little Mountain to do the same outdoor activities while still enjoying its Native, Beautiful, and untouched Landscape.
- 2). If these Oil and Gas Leases are sold this will all go away and we will have lost another Untouched Paradise for all people and future Generations to enjoy. I understand that we need Oil and Gas Exploration in Wyoming, but not here!
- 3). I am an active member and President of the Local Western Wyoming Mule Deer Foundation (not the national foundation) based out of Rock Springs and have been doing Habitat Enhancement projects for the past 12 years in cooperation with the Rock Springs office of the BLM, and the Green River office of the Wyoming Game and Fish Department trying to help repair 100+ years of over grazing. I do not think our little local bases foundation can do any Habitat Enhancement Projects that will combat massive Oil and Gas Exploration in this area. What we have accomplished so far is just a drop in the bucket. If these parcels are sold our efforts will be a drop in the Ocean. Public Lands are to be in the Publics Hands.
