



Mineral Resources Salable All Alternatives Map 17



NOTES:

The entire planning area is open to disposal of mineral materials with the following exceptions:

Alternative A: Within 1/4-mile of the North Platte River for its entire length.

Alternative B: Within 1/4-mile of the North Platte River for its entire length, the South Bighorns/Red Wall Area of Critical Environmental Concern, Cedar Ridge Traditional Cultural Property, Habitat Fragmentation Blocks 1 through 16, Map 20, and the Sand Hills Management Area.

Alternative C: Within 1/4-mile of the North Platte River from Pathfinder Dam to the Dave Johnson Power Plant, Cedar Ridge Traditional Cultural Property, Habitat Fragmentation Blocks 3, 5, 8, 11, 13, 14, 15, and 16, Map 21, and the Sand Hills Management Area.

Alternative D: Within 1/4-mile of the North Platte River between Pathfinder Dam and Robertson Road in Casper.

Alternative E: Within 1/4-mile of the North Platte River between Pathfinder Dam and Natrona/Converse County line, South Bighorns/Red Wall Management Area, Cedar Ridge Traditional Cultural Property, Habitat Fragmentation Blocks 3, 5, 8, 11, and 16 as adjusted, Map 22, and the Sand Hills Management Area.

All alternatives: Bald eagle roost areas and Jackson Canyon ACEC

The South Bighorns/Red Wall and Jackson Canyon Areas of Critical Environmental Concern/Management Area boundaries vary by alternative. Only the largest area is depicted. See Special Designation and Other Management Area Maps 61-65 for variation between alternatives.
