Dear Resource Management Planners;

My name is Richard Inberg, I have been a resident of Fremont County For 52 years. As an avid outdoorsman, I use BLM administrated lands for recreation including pack trips, fishing, hunting , rock hounding, mule riding,hiking, camping, Etc.. As a professional Land Surveyor, I use BLM administrated lands for work including oil well locations, road and pipeline rights of way, mining claim locations Etc.. In the 52 years that I have worked and recreated in the Lander BLM area, I have seen both the bad and good of BLM management practices . I am well aware of the political climate in the state of Wyoming and Fremont County and have no respect for our elected officials and their stance against any form of resource conservation.

I believe in the multiple use concept and a balanced approach to all uses of our public lands, therefor I SUPPORT ALTERNATIVE "D" OF THE MANAGEMENT PLAN ,with some modifications .

Portions of other alternatives and portions of alternative "D" that i would emphasize are as follows:

1. Locatable Minerals, Record No. 2007, Page 74; I support locatable mineral withdrawals for Dubois Valley ,
 Green Mountain and Johnny Behind the Rocks
2. Oil and Gas, Record No. 2009-2013, Pages 75-76; I support closing oil and gas development in the Dubois area,
 Lander Slope, National Historic Trails and Continental Divide National Scenic Trail corridors .
3. Wilderness Study Areas ,Record No. 7022, Page 170; Close all wilderness study areas to motorized and
 mechanical travel as outlined in alternative "B".
- 4.ACEC, Record 6034, Page 134; Support alternative "D" for East Fork. Record 6036, Page 134; Close area of
 environmental concern to motorized travel. Record 6038, Page 135; Support alternative "B". Record 639, Page
 135; Support alternative "B".
5. National Historic and Continental Divide National Scenic Trails , Record 7003; Having pack-tripped and rode
 [mules] all of the Continental Divide Trail and signed a large portion in the Lander area, I support alternative
 "D" with a 5 mile protective scenic corridor on both sides.
- 6, Little Red Creek Complex, Record 1048, Page 72; Having rode much of the area with access from Trail Lake
 and observing illegal OHV traffic in the area,I would support a designation of Wilderness Study area . At the very
 least follow Record 1049, Alternative "B" to protect the area for future wilderness designation. [I don't support
 another designation for our wild lands].

A resource use which seems to be avoided in the plan is Livestock Grazing Management. with apparent areas of overgrazing, to the detriment of our wildlife, it seems the issue should be addressed.
